


River & Estuary

The Cassowary Coast is one of the few places where GTs push into coastal river systems alongside big queenfish. Sight-casting to these fish on lure or fly is the pinnacle of tropical sportfishing.





Cassowary Coast rivers and estuaries offer a range of tropical species. Skip-cast plastic for mangrove jack, sight-fish to rolling Aussie tarpon, and encounter everything from golden snapper, grunter barracuda to estuary cod along the way.

Islands & Inshore Bluewater

Topwater • Jigging • Baitballs



If the weather permits, we'll head out around the tropical islands along the Cassowary Coast. We'll chase bait balls, cast topwater, jig wrecks and fish the fringing reefs – The islands are a great place to stop in for lunch and a swim throughout the day.



We target a range of species around the islands including GT, Spanish mackerel, tuna and coral trout. The bluewater days are wind and weather dependent, but are always a fun day out in stunning locations.



Our 19ft Sportsman is the ultimate vessel for exploring the inshore islands – each one a tropical paradise. From sandy beaches to reef edges and jungle backdrops, these days are all about variety, comfort, and chasing fish in tropical settings.

Rainforest Backcountry

Jungle Perch • Sooty Grunter • Pristine creeks



Backcountry fishing for tropical native species in stunning crystal-clear rainforest tributaries – we walk and wade these creeks with special permits to access National Park areas.



The jungle perch and sooty grunter are the iconic species of the tropical streams. Both eat topwater and are great fun on light tackle – perfect for fly or lure.



It's a relaxing change of pace from long boat days and a great way to experience the rainforest on foot, immersed in nature.
